SCANNERS HEAR IT FIRST

NOTES IN PASSING

Due to technical difficulties beyond my control my column is actually here this month for all to see. Sorry about last month, "the mind was mush". Its May (feels like late November) and the scanner has been active enough to keep an interest in the hobby, at least the times I listen as my daily schedule has been busier than past. I've been tuning into 412.8125, upper Richelieu Valley mutual aid system, as of lately more activity as each town advises "Bromont Central" of their goings on be it pager test confirmation or en route to fire/rescue/EMS calls in their local area. I am presently trying to collect the info on the station numberings and 10 code system (codes seem to parallel SSIM). A portrayal of this system coming to a page in the Marcogram near you soon.

The Montreal Police riot squad has been heard training on a few frequencies recently 412.6875 and 410.2625 to mention a few (after the sweep of four games to two by the Hurricanes I know its not a Stanley Cup riot they are practicing for).

If you scan 412.9625 / 159.120, Kahanawake Fire Brigade, you will hear their latest acquisition "Engine 4" is their new American LaFrance Rescue Pumper decked out in do-dads to the nines I'm hoping there is a accompanying photo in this issue if I have received it in time. If not just close your eyes and picture a very large and very multi-functioned vehicle that if you were in traffic and saw this coming up behind you in the mirror doing "Jack-the-bear" get out of the same postal code because it will use you as a bumper ornament (see that fire boot... now look up... look way up!).

The SSIM is still active on UHF 412.7625 interconnected with the trunk system they are using. The drawback is when they are on the 800 MHz the simulcast to 412.7625 cuts off in long transmissions and can be a pain especially when an officer is giving a size-up and just as he is about to give the all-important update code it cuts off. Central hears them but we get to scan in limbo in the meantime trying to figure out what he said at the end. The new trunk tracker BC-250XLT will be out in the fall and will have the APCO-25 board so we can miss nothing and get out of limbo in the future. As you have also noticed the audio quality from 800 MHz to UHF sucks canal water big time. At times it sounds like an NFL referee announcing "Dallas No. 23, offside, 5 yards, 1st. down Green Bay" with all the echoes and everything (just my observation).

Keep on getting those earfuls. 73, Frederick and the cats.

On the morning of May 2nd a long time recognizable voice of the Dollard des Ormeaux Fire Department has taken his retirement, after 30 years and 5 months.
