This event is the Jay Challenge in Jay, Vermont.

- who is the target audience?
- what is the purpose of the video (information, training, promotional)?
- What is the method of delivery?

In the Part 2 of the presentation I showed two short video clips from material that had already been shot.

From my part, I feel that we need to emphasize not just the hobby aspect of using radio transmitters and receivers but the social and emergency uses of these facilities by radio amateurs. Canada is a country of volunteers and I hope this will help encourage some young people to join us.
